# General Interior Plant Care

## Transporting

- Interior tropical foliage plants can be damaged by certain weather conditions. In the summer the plant needs proper ventilation, avoid placing the plant in a closed vehicle for long periods of time.
- In the winter be sure that the plants are properly insulated before they leave the store. The easiest way of doing this is placing it in a paper sleeve or plastic bag so it is protected from the elements.

## Light

- Light is necessary for all plants because they use this energy source to manufacture food.
- Because many interior plants are grown in a greenhouse under some sort of shade they are not use to direct sunlight. Inside, we often must supplement light by using incandescent or fluorescent lights or by placing the plants near a window. Most interior plants prefer bright indirect lighting conditions. We suggest placing the plants near a window.

## Temperature

- Most interior plants tolerate the normal temperatures found in homes and offices.

## Watering

- Keep soil moist - be careful not to overwater as there is typically no drainage in containers. The most common cause of a sick houseplant is watering, wither too much or not enough. If the plant's leaves are starting to look wilted, yellow, or are drying up, check the soil and if it is dry add a good amount of water to wet the dirt and leave it moist once the water has run through.

## Nutrients

- Feed with mild liquid fertilizer monthly.
